# How to get here

### **Entrances**

The Oak Cancer Centre has two entrances with the main entrance on the ground level, accessed via Cotswold Road.

The Oak Cancer Centre can also be accessed from the existing hospital and Downs Road entrance via a corridor on the ground level of the East Wing.

## **Parking**

If driving, please use the Cotswold Road entrance where there is dedicated patient parking near the entrances. This includes accessible parking and electric charging vehicle bays as shown on the map overleaf.

There is also a dedicated patient drop-off area outside the Oak Cancer Centre. Please use the Cotswold Road entrance if you are being dropped off for your appointment.


If using a Sat Nav or maps the postcode SM2 5NG will take you to Cotswold Road.







## Before your appointment

You will have been informed directly by letter if your appointment is in the Oak Cancer Centre.

Please arrive on time for your appointment and bring your appointment letter and any medications with you.

### **Volunteers**

Our volunteers help us deliver the best services and improve the lives of people affected by cancer. If you are unsure where to go when you arrive, one of our meet-and-greet volunteers in a lilac shirt will be able to help you sign in.

## Checking in

Upon arrival please go to the department stated on your appointment letter.

We will ask you to check in at a self check-in kiosk and take a seat until you are called for your appointment.

When the clinician is ready to see you, your name and the room you will be seen in will be displayed on the screen in the waiting area. You will also receive a text or a notification on MyMarsden if you have opted into either of these communication preferences.

### Café

The Barista & Baker café on the ground level offers coffee and a small range of snacks. Hot food is available at The Cherry Tree Restaurant in the main hospital building.

# **Charles Wolfson Rapid Diagnostic Centre**

# Lower ground level

The Charles Wolfson Rapid Diagnostic Centre is for patients with suspected cancer symptoms to have diagnostic tests and care without delay. The Oak Cancer Centre allows us to increase the number of patients we can see by expanding our specialist diagnostic services in Sutton.

A whole range of diagnostic techniques are performed, including diagnostic imaging (mammography and ultrasound), tissue sampling and biopsies. The majority of patients will have their required tests performed and results available on the same day.

If your appointment is in the Charles Wolfson Rapid Diagnostic Centre, please arrive using the Charles Wolfson Rapid Diagnostic Centre entrance on the lower ground level.

# Outpatients and Haematology Outpatients Ground level

Outpatients and Haematology Outpatients provide clinics for undiagnosed patients, patients receiving treatment and patients on follow up. By bringing together all outpatient departments on a single level, patients can undergo blood tests, see their consultant, and collect a prescription without visiting different levels.

If your appointment is in Outpatients or Haematology Outpatients, please arrive using the Oak Cancer Centre main entrance. Haematology Outpatients is on your left and Outpatients is in front of you. Both areas have their own reception desk.

# **Pharmacy**

# **Opening times**

Monday to Friday 8.30am-6.30pm

Saturday 9am-1pm

Sunday Closed

If you need to collect a prescription following your appointment, you will find the Pharmacy on the ground level. This service is delivered by RM Medicines, a wholly owned partner of The Royal Marsden, specialised to deliver the outpatient pharmacy service for the Trust.

If you are on a research trial you will need to collect your prescription from the Research Pharmacy, which is located by the Downs Road main entrance.



# **Olayan Day Care Unit**

#### Level two

The Olayan Day Care Unit is a treatment area which provides care for patients receiving chemotherapy and other cancer treatments. This has been designed specifically to maximise the comfort of patients by creating a bright and peaceful environment with generous space.

If your appointment is in the Olayan Day Care Unit, please arrive using the Oak Cancer Centre main entrance and take the main lifts or stairs up to level two.

# **Goldman Sachs Centre for Urgent Care**

### Level two

The Goldman Sachs Centre for Urgent Care is a state-of-theart facility where patients who become unwell can be quickly assessed, treated and where possible avoid being sent to a local A&E department.

It has been designed so that patients receive their treatment and care in a private and calming environment. This larger unit will allow us to increase the number of patients that can be seen by the specialist teams. If you need to be treated in the Goldman Sachs Centre for Urgent Care, you will be booked in by your clinical team.

# **Kuok Research Centre**

# Levels one, two, three

The Oak Cancer Centre is also home to the Kuok Research Centre where more than 400 researchers are now under the same roof as patients and clinicians. This highlights the central part our patients play in clinical research by taking part in clinical trials.

Having researchers from different tumour specialities working alongside each other for the first time means they can easily share their latest innovations. This will help speed up the development of new treatments that will save the lives of patients.
